One Flock, One Shepherd

A blessed Good Shepherd Sunday!

In the Gospel our Lord Jesus calls Himself the good shepherd. As a good shepherd He lays down his life for his sheep. A shepherd has one thing to do: *Keep sheep safe*. The safety and welfare of the flock is a shepherd's absolute number-one priority. This means that a shepherd must find good pasture for the sheep. He must lead them to safe water. He must make sure that they do not munch on poisonous plants. He must guard the flock against predators. He is the one who makes the ultimate sacrifice. He thinks more of the needs of the flock than his own.

Not only does he love us, but Christ also knows we belong to him. He says that He has other sheep that are not of this fold and that these sheep He also has to gather together: "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So, there will be one flock, one shepherd."

This suggests our mission -- to announce the inclusive love of Christ and to reach out to all whom he loves. The Shepherd offers tender care for anybody who can receive it. He speaks to keep inviting and challenging all to come. And he will need all the help He can get to accomplish it.

There is one Good Shepherd, and it is Jesus Christ. We depend on him more than we rely on ourselves. As we thank Him for being the good shepherd, let us show our gratitude by taking up His challenge to be instruments in gathering His sheep into one flock under the one shepherd.
